INTRODUCTION


We need more Carbon Capture Facilities

CO2 (Million Metric Tons)

CC captures over 50 million metric tonnes of CO2 anually.

That number is nothing,

37.15 billion metric tonnes of CO2 is exhausted into the atmosphere in 2022.

In 2021, Indonesia **alone** produced over **619 Million** Metric Tonnes of CO2.



The BIGGEST Problem with Carbon Capture


Carbon Capture is **EXPENSIVE**








Lack of knowledge: Public awareness and negative perceptions about the environmental risks
